ii) Cst. Phillips (RCMP in EOC) is working with EOC Logistics to solidify plan.

##### b) EOC RCMP Personnel:

i) Phillips addressed a need for consistency in RCMP personnel working EOC and is putting together a list of proposed members and schedules.

#### 3) Re-Entry Plan:

a) Meetings held all day with S/Sgt. Henry as RCMP representative.

b) Proposed re-entry plan attached.

c) Henry has concerns outlined in attachment.

4) Tow Operation:

- a) Over 200 vehicles towed today, but still have a way to go.
- b) The secure tow site is almost at capacity, but another site has been identified.
- c) RCMP does not need to cover security of tow site.
- d) EOC is working out a plan for vehicle recovery.

5) Pet Rescue Operation:

- a) 430 pets rescued thus far.
- b) Still have numerous outstanding addresses to be checked.
- c) Still require RCMP resources to assist in this operation.

6) Media:

- a) Daily Technical Media set up at EOC from 1100- 1300 hrs
- b) Will be able to address issues/rumors proactively.
- c) EOC states RCMP will be covering all security of this daily event.

7) Other of note:

- a) Key Position Chiefs in ECO are changing over from Lethbridge Fire Dept to Strathcona Fire Dept. There was some position shadowing today, and the new Chiefs will be operational tomorrow.
- b) Centre Street bridge has been inspected and has been opened for active Emergency use only, not for convenience nor routine patrols.
- c) Speed of motorists in town has been too fast on roads with dried mud causing dust levels that are a hazard to home inspectors and other workers. To address this issue, street cleaning crews will start working during the night to clear debris and sweep streets.

<p><b>CAMP CAYLEY:</b> S/Sgt. Dave MITCHELL: Pod 1 is almost complete. This will have 24 beds available for us. Pod 2 is being set up for tomorrow. This will have 44 beds for us giving a total of 68 beds for Sunday night. Pods 3&amp;4 are being delivered tomorrow and should be up and running on Monday. There will be a total of 156 beds once all 4 pods are up and running.</p> <p>We need a decision regarding alcohol at camp.</p> <p>We are still working through issues with the meals. Issue with what was believed to have been included versus what's in the contracts. We should know this afternoon.</p> <p>Rooms may not be available during change over.</p> <p>CM Aaron CLACK: We can't link the TV/satellite and WIFI with the contract for the camp. We need to look at a quick competitive process by Tuesday for the satellite and wifi.</p> <p>C/Supt. STEPHENSON: If it goes over a million dollars it has to go through the Minister.</p> <p>Cpl. Fern CURRIE: Need Duty NCO and assistant for night security at camp. Sgt. Lorne ADAMITZ will look into this.</p> <p>S/Sgt. Dave MITCHELL: We have room for 68 members at camp tomorrow.</p>	<p>MITCHELL: Figure out the numbers and how many will be required to go to U of C</p>
<p><b>FIREARMS SEIZURES:</b> S/Sgt. Grant GINGERYSTY: S/Sgt. Kevin MORTON is in charge of firearms returns.</p>	

<p>A/Commr. Marianne RYAN suggested a less formal document for getting in touch with gun owners. She wants the firearms returned as fast as possible and doesn't want a long formal process.</p> <p>C/Supt. STEPHENSON: We need to find the owners of the guns.</p> <p>S/Sgt. Grant GINGERYSTY: More resources are needed for the return of the firearms.</p> <p>Sgt. Patricia NEELY: People have been calling asking what to do to obtain their firearms.</p> <p>C/Supt. STEPHENSON: There will be a process of providing ID, proof of ownership etc. prior to getting firearms returned.</p> <p>There are some special cases such as unregistered and restricted firearms.</p> <p>If people want us to keep their firearms for safekeeping, we will.</p> <p>Sgt. Patricia NEELY: Residents are being advised to call SAOCC to report damages. SAOCC will generate a PROS file and assign it to a member in High River to follow up.</p>	
<p><b>DECONTAMINATION:</b> S/Sgt. Grant GINGERYSTY: Decontamination has been set up so that members will go through prior to getting to camp.</p>	
<p><b>RE-ENTRY OF RESIDENTS:</b> S/Sgt. Grant GINGERYSTY: There were 500-600 people attempting re-entry and there were traffic concerns arising from this.</p> <p>S/Sgt. Grant GINGERYSTY: Had 2 meetings today with Insp. Jim STEWART at 1000 and 1500 hrs. Re-entry is occurring in the NW part of High River. S/Sgt. Glenn HENRY got us a Re-Entry Document for the residents.</p> <p>C/Supt. STEPHENSON: There was traffic about miles long for re-entry. They are looking to change the hours of re-entry to 24/7.</p>

<p>S/Sgt. Roberta McKALE: When people were fainting at the registration areas, the Red Cross was telling them to call in ambulances.</p> <p>Cst. Bill PRINGLE: There is already an ambulance on site, but this is above and beyond that.</p>

Grant GINGERYSTY: The High River Detachment is now on ROSS.</p> <p>Fish and Wildlife have been assisting with pets.</p> <p>690 pets have been rescued.</p> <p>The Premiere will be on site tomorrow at 0930 hrs tomorrow.</p> <p>There have been members complaining of bed bugs at the U of C.</p>

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Spoke with S/Sgt. Kevin Morton. He will liaise with Insp. Stewart's group to acquire 5 resources to review all firearms seized during this evacuation. Each firearm will be subject of a CPIC check to ensure that it is not stolen property. S/Sgt. Morton confirms that a PROS entry has been created for each address that firearms were located and subsequently seized for safe keeping. When the owner presents, PROS will be searched by address given. The firearms are documented on paper 1625 Exhibit forms. All efforts will be made to ensure ownership and the owners ability to safely store prior to turning firearms over. Once returned the owner will sign the 1625 returned. This document can be scanned to PROS. It is not a requirement to add property to PROS Property screen. S/Sgt. Morton will draft a plan that outlines a consistent procedure for this process. **2013/06/28**

Cst EPP was requested by EOC in High River to attend the High River RCMP detachment to deal with firearms that had been secured by other police officers in the previous days. Upon arrival at the High River Detachment, Cst EPP assisted several other members in logging all of the firearms that had been secured from High River residences and brought to the High River Detachment. All of the firearms were already grouped together with tags showing which house they came from. Cst EPP went through several groups of the firearms and documented the following for each firearm on an exhibit report: make, model, serial number and address from which they were secured. After each group of firearms was documented they were then moved into the secure prisoner bay and stacked on bicycle racks. Each group of firearms had an exhibit report attached to it for easy reference. Copies of the exhibit reports were then placed inside of an operational file folder showing the address from where they were secured and forwarded to watch clerks for PROS files to be created. An individual PROS file was created for each residence from which firearms were secured.

**2013/06/29**

Cst EPP was requested by Sgt Ian SHARDLOW to attend the High River RCMP Detachment to continue working with the secured firearms. The first task given to Cst EPP and Cpl Christine COLLINS was to move all of the firearms from the secure prisoner bay into the garage next door. After all of the firearms were moved to the garage they were organized into eight different predetermined zones of the town. Each zone was labeled with a tag for easy reference. This was done to make the return of firearms easier for police officers and the firearm owners in High River. Cst EPP and Cpl COLLINS then completed CFRO checks on every serial number from every firearm that was secured. This was done to ensure that none of the seized firearms were reported stolen and to ensure that the owners of restricted and/or prohibited firearms were properly licensed and properly registered.

**2013/06/30**

Cst EPP was requested by Sgt Ian SHARDLOW to attend the High River RCMP Detachment to continue working with the secured firearms. Cst EPP was advised that a decision was made to start returning firearms to residents of High River. Cst EPP was advised that a media release was going to be sent out to advise the residents of High River that their firearms were being returned. Cst EPP and Cpl COLLINS began calling members of the public that had returned to their homes to advise that they could attend the High River RCMP Detachment to pick up their firearms. Cst EPP personally spoke with several firearm owners who stated that they were happy that their firearms were secure and asked to leave them with the RCMP until they could get their homes repaired. Throughout the entire day only three residents attended the detachment to retrieve their firearms. Cst EPP and Cpl COLLINS received positive feedback from these residents who stated they were very happy that their firearms were secured and kept in good condition.

**Re:** **High River Flood Firearms Seizure Documentation**

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I received a request on August 12, 2013 from S/Sgt. Dave NESS indicating the need for a spreadsheet containing information regarding Firearm Seizures that occurred in High River during the state of emergency flood beginning on June 20, 2013. As a result, I have been utilizing a variety of resources to compile this spreadsheet. Sources of information have included: the initial spreadsheet created by Cpl. REID and Cpl. DAWKINS, PROS, E&R, scribe notes, member notes, email correspondence, and telephone conversations.

The Information that is documented within the spreadsheet includes: the date, PROS occurrence number, residential street number, residential street name, zone (according to the High River civic address mapping system provided by the City of High River), the “Lead Investigator” as per PROS and their regimental number, the initial action taken by police, the location where the firearm(s) were recovered, the resulting action taken by police, the type of firearm (i.e.: shotgun, handgun, rifle, and other), any comments, and the total number of firearms.

The results are as follows:

- High River had a total of 192 Firearms Files (Firearm Act – Other Activities) between 2013/06/20 and 2013/08/12. The total number of firearms involved was 725\*<sup>1</sup>
- 112 files related to firearm seizures. 609\* firearms were seized (452\* firearms were returned to the owner)
- 40 files related to the voluntary surrender of firearms. (107\* firearms were voluntarily surrendered).

Unfortunately, there are certain circumstances which have resulted in the inability to locate and document accurate information. Consequently, the spreadsheet can only be interpreted as an approximation of the firearm statistics from the High River Flood.

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<sup>1</sup> Files 2013826172, 2013829083, and 2013835887 do not have a confirmed number or type of firearm documented. Therefore, 725 is an approximation.

**SITUATION:** EOC has just advised there is potential for renewed flooding in High River in the next 48 to 72 hrs should predicted heavy rainfalls come to pass

### BACKGROUND:

EOC is in the process of preliminary planning for further flooding in High River should predicted heavy rainfall swell local rivers.

Presently public notifications will go out this evening to local residents of the potential for further flooding and subsequent evacuations or discouragement from returning to the townsite.

Early warning systems are been put in place to monitor potential flood levels.

### STRATEGIC CONSIDERATIONS:

Should further serious flooding come about this could impact upon deployment levels as the timing of the event would coincide with the change over of our resources.

Should an actual threat come to pass the recommendation will be to hold our current deployment as required.

Considerable logistical challenges including housing would likely arise if we are so challenged.

We will continue to monitor these developments closely. In the interim we will continue present plans and operations.
